SCHOOL UNIFORM INFORMATION

Our school has a strict uniform policy and dress code that is fully endorsed by the school's P&C. We are very proud of the fact that our students from Prep to Year 6 are in full school uniform every day. Our uniform instils a sense of pride in the school, is sun safe and is designed to ensure that students can participate in the full range of activities offered.

The school uniform is primarily based on the school polo shirt. The polo shirt is royal blue in colour and features the school logo and "Dare to Do Well" motto printed in white. The polo shirt may be worn with royal blue shorts or royal blue skirts. The school hat is broad brimmed, royal blue in colour with the school logo printed on the front.

Orders have been taken from current Year 5 students for a special Year 6 commemorative shirt, another order will be placed by our Uniform Shop early in the year. Year 6 commemorative shirts can be worn on Fridays.

<u>School Shoes</u>

When choosing school shoes for your child next year please ensure that you select ioggers. Our students participate in a wide range of physical activity including daily endurance running, PE lessons and organised sport and games during breaks.

The wearing of correct footwear such as joggers ensures that students can participate safely in these activities. Skate shoes, slip-ons, volleys and other fashionable shoes are not to be worn to school. They come off easily during games and cause students to fall and trip. Students must wear joggers with laces or velcro straps that can be tied securely.

School Hats

The only acceptable hat is the broad brimmed school hat with a firm brim. Other forms such as caps, small or floppy brimmed hats do not meet our sun safety guidelines and are not part of the school uniform. The school uniform shop sells a high-quality sun-safe school hat.

School hats are to be kept free from any form of graffiti. Student names are to be clearly written on the inside of the hat (for younger students the name can be neatly written on the brim of the hat for easy identification). School hats that contain graffiti will not be accepted as part of the school uniform.

LUNCH BOXES

Through the generosity of our P&C every classroom in the school is equipped with a fridge to store student lunches. This allows parents to prepare a wide range of healthy lunches knowing that the food will remain fresh and not spoil.

The fridges were purchased to cater for 25 -30 normal sized plastic lunchboxes. Many students are now bringing to school large lunchboxes that are padded (insulated) and include drink bottle holders and other accessories. These lunch boxes are often twice the size of a normal lunchbox and restrict the number that can be placed in the classroom fridge.

If you wish your child's lunch box to be placed in the classroom fridge, please ensure that you purchase a normal sized plastic lunch box. Insulated lunchboxes will not be placed in classroom fridges.
